## **INTRUSIVE INTERVENTION**

#### **Intrusive Intervention**

**Being an intrusive presence** is not intended to be annoying or obtrusive, but a reliable, supportive, and caring presence in all areas of young people's lives. As an intrusive presence, though, we cannot limit ourselves to only the academic aspects of their lives.

Being an intrusive presence is the

objective that we are promoting this school year. These kind of influences can help

prevent later problems in young people such as depression, eating disorders, and

substance abuse. Who is qualified to be an intrusive presence in the lives of teenagers?

Any adult who has integrity, a genuine

respect for young people can be qualified for this great responsibility. Integrity in a

person as we understand it, is the quality of having the same values in private and public life. Integrity is important in all of our lives and it happens to be one of the qualities that our youth pick up on very quickly. If you lack integrity, young people will find you out and then shut you out. Sharing experiences is also key...

When young people hear the stories about the obstacles that we had to overcome, They will be encouraged to persevere.

An intrusive adult must also have respect for youth. This respect should not be limited to those with whom we have a direct relationship. We need to respect their friends as well. We mustn't walk through the mall and stereotype our youth based on their appearances or which concert shirt they are wearing.

Otherwise our youth will realize that they are only worthy of our respect if they look or act a certain way.

Words have meaning: Take a moment to remember the saying, Words have meaning, so watch what you say". Meaning involves feeling as well as thought. Consider your thoughts about words referring to mischievous children as little devils, wicked rascals, or delinquents. Children who learn these such words from adults are usually to young to realize that such terms degrade them. Most adults know that offensive language is hurtful to others. Besides, some parents and teachers will not tolerate behavior in which a child uses speech in a disrespectful manner. Matter of respect and obedience, they see the use of decent language as good personal behavior.

An ongoing struggle, it takes a great deal of effort to combat indecent

language, Especially when adults maintain an attitude that using abusive

language when you scold a child makes a child less likely to misbehave.

There's another struggle with words, the ones used on TV and radio.

For example, a prison word such as "lockdown" is used when a school has all doors locked. This one term makes it possible to envision school as jail,

principal as warden, teachers as corrections officers, classmates as inmates, and security guards as the swat team. It's possible to imagine being stripped searched, subdued in handcuffs, and interrogated.

Let's not forget foul words pollute the minds of our children, teenagers, and young adults. VERBAL POLLUTION is out of control, and we have to

restrain it because punishing words cause dejection. In watching your words, take charge in deciding between language that is demeaning and language that is meaningful. Whatever is decided, YOU have control over words.

## Thirteenth Avenue PTA hosts Class of 2013 Parent Dinner: February 7, 2013

On Thursday, February 7, 2013, The Thirteenth Avenue PTA hosted a Class of 2013 Parent Dinner in our school cafeteria.

Eighth Grade students and parents had the opportunity to obtain vital information . Presenters included: Ms. Siliato, School Guidance Counselor spoke to parents about the High School Admissions process. A Common Application for high schools will be available online for students to apply beginning February 22nd. A High School Fair will be held on March 9th at Central High School for all Eighth graders and their parents. The Admission criteria will include: ACT Explorer Test results, 1st two marking period grades for grade 8, and seventh grade report cards. Ms. Siliato also stated that auditions have already been held for Arts High School

Ms. Colin, Class Advisor introduced herself and distributed a Class of 2013 Activity Schedule. Parents were informed that Eighth Grade Graduation Photos would be taken on February 22nd. Each eighth grade is expected to pay graduation dues. Parents were informed that graduation rings were optional and students will pay their graduation dues in Three(3) installments. A Graduation Trip to Washington, DC is also being planned. In addition, A Graduation Social will be held at the Galloping Hills. Students will also enter a behavioral contract to determine what graduation activities they can participate in.

Ms. Waddell, 8th Grade Resource Teacher gave an overview of the NJ ASK 8 Test that eighth graders will take in May 2013. Ms. Waddell stated that the NJASK was a proficiency test that is given in the State of New Jersey. Ms. Waddell stated that a student needed a score of 200 or higher to pass the Language Arts Portion and a 200 or higher to pass the Math Section. In addition, Fourth and Eighth graders are required to take the Science portion. Students will be expected to write two(2) persuasive essays and scientific notation will also be on the test. Some parents stated they felt their children were unprepared to take the test since they have had various substitute teachers teaching Science and other core subjects the entire school year. Several parents stated their children should have the opportunity to opt out of the NJASK Testing and request the ACT Explorers test not be factored into their child's admission criteria for high school.

Ms. Waddell stated that an NJASK Academy is being coordinated to help students prepare for the NJASK. A Saturday Academy was also being considered. Ms. Williams, Interim Principal interjected that Extended learning time is available for students on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Ms. Cheryl Howard, Community Organizer for Urban League of Essex County also spoke about the Safe Corridors Partnership Initiative that was launched this school year to ensure students had safe passage to/from school daily.

Mr. Donald Chester, parent spoke to parents and students about the importance of staying in school and staying out of trouble. Mr. Chester shared his personal story of being involved in gang activity and the pain of being separated from his children during his period of incarceration. What was more moving was having Mr. Chester's son speak about the effect his Dad's incarceration had on him and how supportive his dad has been since his release and the impact his Dad's incarceration had on him.

Mr. Brown, PTA President requested parents and students to sign a mutual contract to use cell phones during inappropriate times. Parents signed the written agreement not to text and drive and students signed not to use cell phones during classroom instruction. The Program is a National PTA Initiative. Mr. Brown also encouraged parents to join PTA and invited families to return on February 21st for our 2013 Family Night Celebration. Mr. Brown also stated that students seeking summer employment must be 14 years old by February 14th. Working papers can be obtained at 321 Bergen Street or the Board of Education-2 Cedar Street. Student Behavior in 8th Grade was also discussed and Newark Public School Discipline Policy Handbooks, Grading Policy and 13th Avenue P-Reports were also distributed.

Parents and students enjoyed a delicious dinner which included a Shrimp Salad, Fried Chicken and Tossed Salad.

On Friday, February 15, 2013, Newark Public Schools' held **Parent/Teacher Conference Day** from 1-7 p.m. Parents and guardians had the opportunity to conference with staff, teachers and administrators, obtain student report cards, join PTA, register for Free Public Library cards, Join PTA Committees/Clubs, receive Healthy Lifestyle Snack packs and enjoy a delicious cheesecake social. The next **Report Card Day** is May 2, 2013 and Progress Reports will be issued on March 13, 2013.
