World History Summer Assignment



Welcome to World History at Arts High School!

Your summer assignment for this course is due the FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL, on paper, to your teacher. It will count as a grade first marking cycle.

This type of assignment is known as a Document Based Question (DBQ for short). A DBQ assignment usually has the following format:

- A series of documents, usually with short response questions that follow each. The point of the short response questions is to direct your attention to certain aspects of the document and to aid in your understanding of it.
- An essential question which must be answered in an essay (usually 1-3 pages) in which you refer to specific documents in the packet to support your viewpoint.

YOUR ASSIGNMENT is to:

1. Answer the questions on page 2 of this packet (this part is mandatory).
2. Analyze the DBQ documents and answer the short response questions for each document in this packet (this part is mandatory).
3. For extra credit you may choose to write a 1-2 page essay responding to the essential question of the DBQ. (This part is optional)

Typed responses are preferred, neatly written responses are acceptable.

You must be prepared to take a quiz on the Middle Ages within the first week of school.

Part 1.

Historical Context: The Middle Ages is the name given to the time period between 400 and 1500 AD. In Europe, this is the time of knights, lords, the black plague and the Catholic Church. This is also the time when Europe, Africa and Asia collided because of a series of wars known as the Crusades.

Part 2.

1. Carefully read each document based question prior to reading the accompanying document.
2. Now, read each document carefully and underline key phrases and words that address the document based question. Use a dictionary to look up words that are unfamiliar to you. You may also make brief notes to assist you.
3. Based on the information found in each document, answer the questions that follow the documents.

Document 1

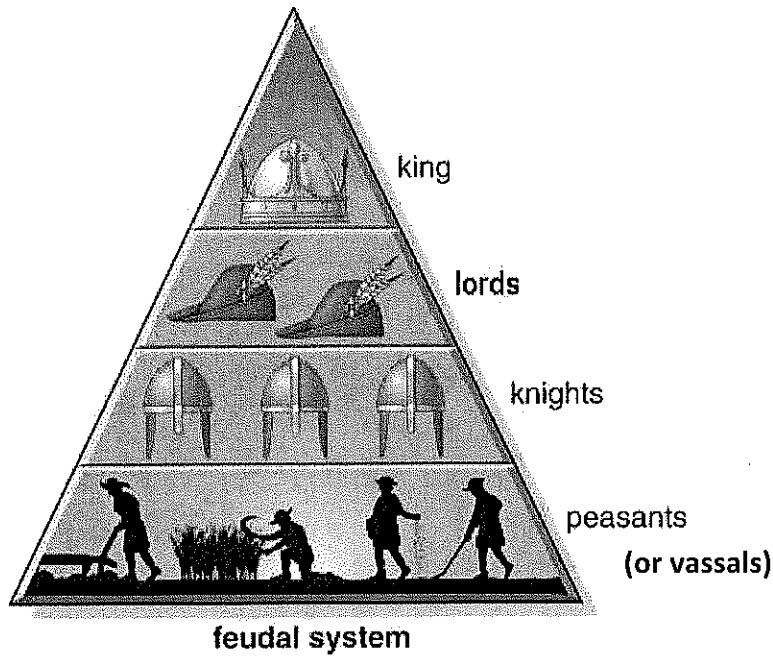
In *The Middle Ages*, historian Frantz Funck-Brentano made use of previously published texts to describe Europe in the ninth and tenth centuries (Heinemann, 1922, pp. 1-3).

The barbarians have broken through the ramparts. The Saracen [Moors] invasions have spread in successive waves over the South. The Hungarians swarm over the Eastern provinces . . . they sacked town and village, and laid waste the fields. They burned down the churches and then departed with a crowd of captives. . . . There is no longer any trade, only unceasing terror. . . . The peasant has abandoned his ravaged fields to avoid the violence of anarchy. The people have gone to cower in the depths of the forests or in inaccessible regions, or have taken refuge in the high mountains. . . . Society has no longer any government. . . .

A Church council calls for the observance of the Truce of God, 1083.

... That from the first day of the Advent of our Lord through Epiphany ... and throughout the year on every Sunday, Friday, and Saturday, and on the fast days of the four seasons ... this decree of peace shall be observed ... so that no one may commit murder, arson, robbery, or assault, no one may injure another with a sword, club, or any kind of weapon. ... On ... every day set aside, or to be set aside, for fasts or feasts, arms may be carried, but on this condition, that no injury shall be done in any way to any one ... If it shall happen that any castle is besieged during the days which are included within the peace, the besiegers shall cease from attack unless they are set upon by the besieged and compelled to beat the latter back. ...

This description of the positive aspects of the Middle Ages was taken from *Medieval Europe* by H. C. Davis, Oxford University Press, 1946, p. 79.

... Medieval culture was imperfect, was restricted to a narrow circle of superior minds. ... Measure it, however, by the memories and the achievements that it has bequeathed to the modern world, and it will be found not unworthy to rank with those of earlier and later Golden Ages. It flourished in the midst of rude surroundings, fierce passions, and material ambitions ... we must judge of them by their philosophy and law, by their poetry and architecture. ...

Document 7

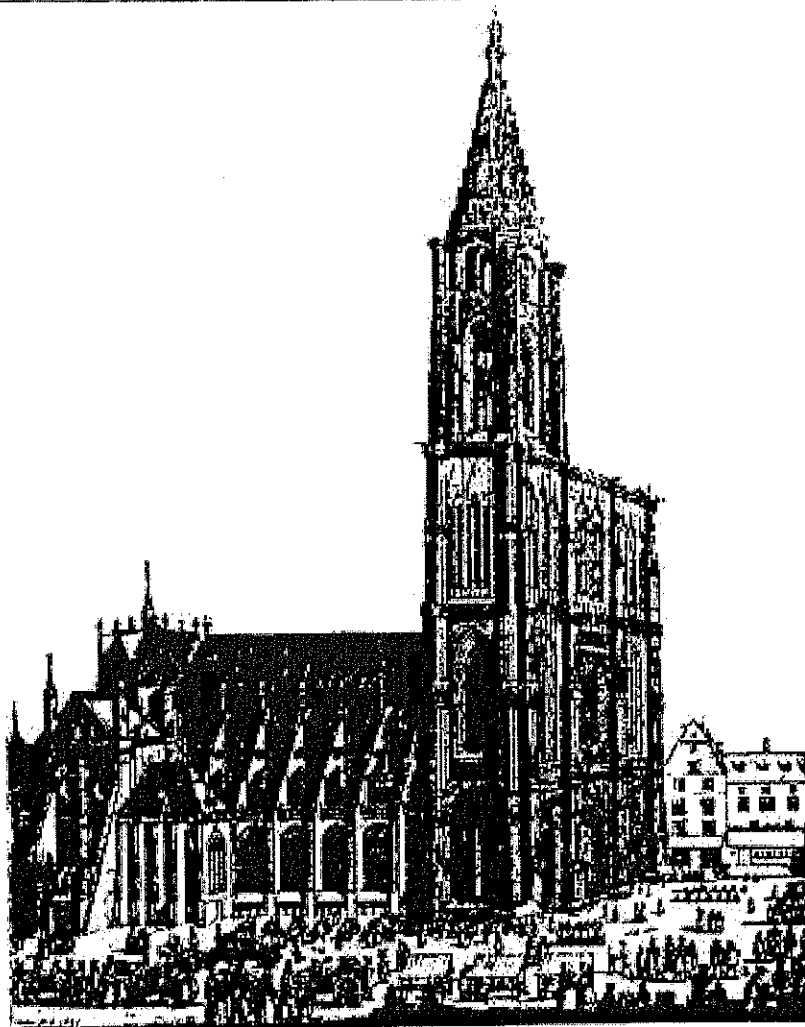
In 1095, Pope Urban II issued a call for a holy crusade—a war to recapture the Holy Land.

They have occupied more and more of the lands of those Christians. . . They have killed and captured many, and have destroyed the churches and devastated the Empire. . . All who die by the way, whether by land or sea, or in battle against the pagans, shall have immediate remission of sins.

Part 3. OPTIONAL EXTRA CREDIT

Directions: 1. Based on your knowledge and on the information found in the documents, formulate a thesis that directly answers the following question:

Question: *Which labels for the Middle Ages best describe the era between 500 and 1400 in Europe: The Dark Ages, the Age of Feudalism, the Age of Faith, or the Golden Age of Europe? You must discuss three labels.*

NOTE: A thesis statement is included towards the beginning of your paper and is a summary of the main point of a paper, a summary of the argument a paper contains, or a summary of the position that the paper is going to take.

2. Organize supportive and relevant information into a brief outline.
3. Write a well-organized 1-2 page essay proving your thesis. The essay should be logically presented and should include information from the documents and from your own outside knowledge.

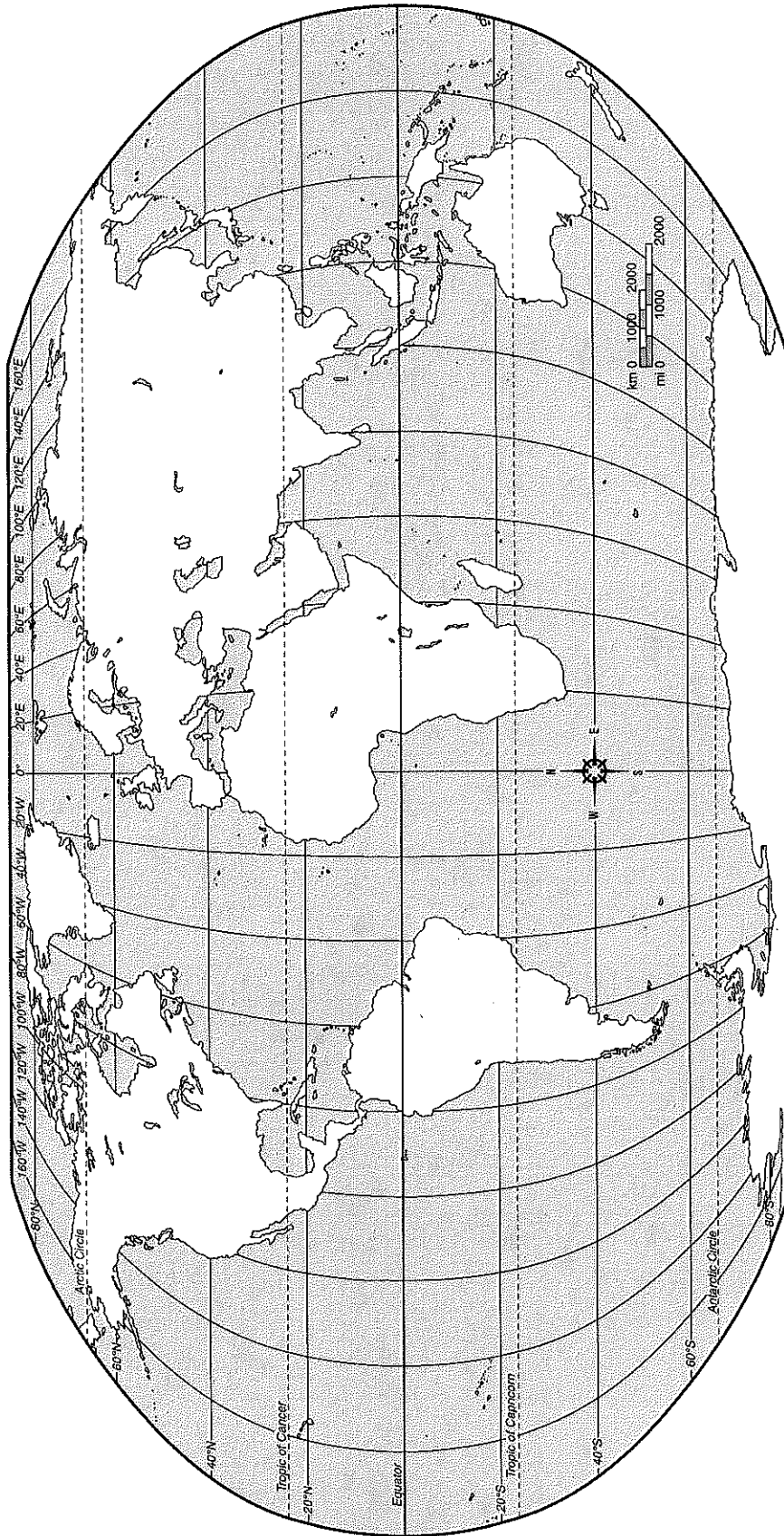
