



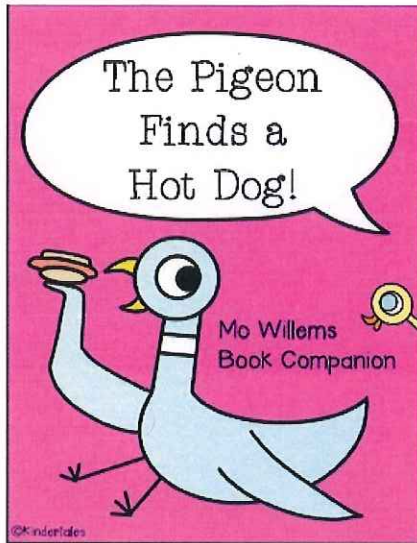

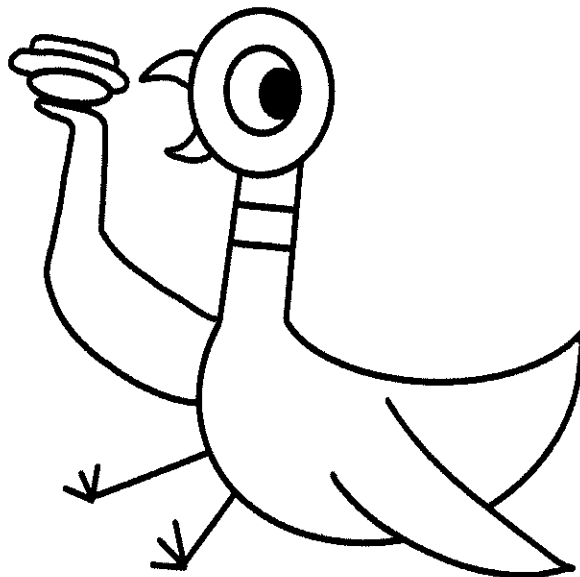
ASSIGNMENT:

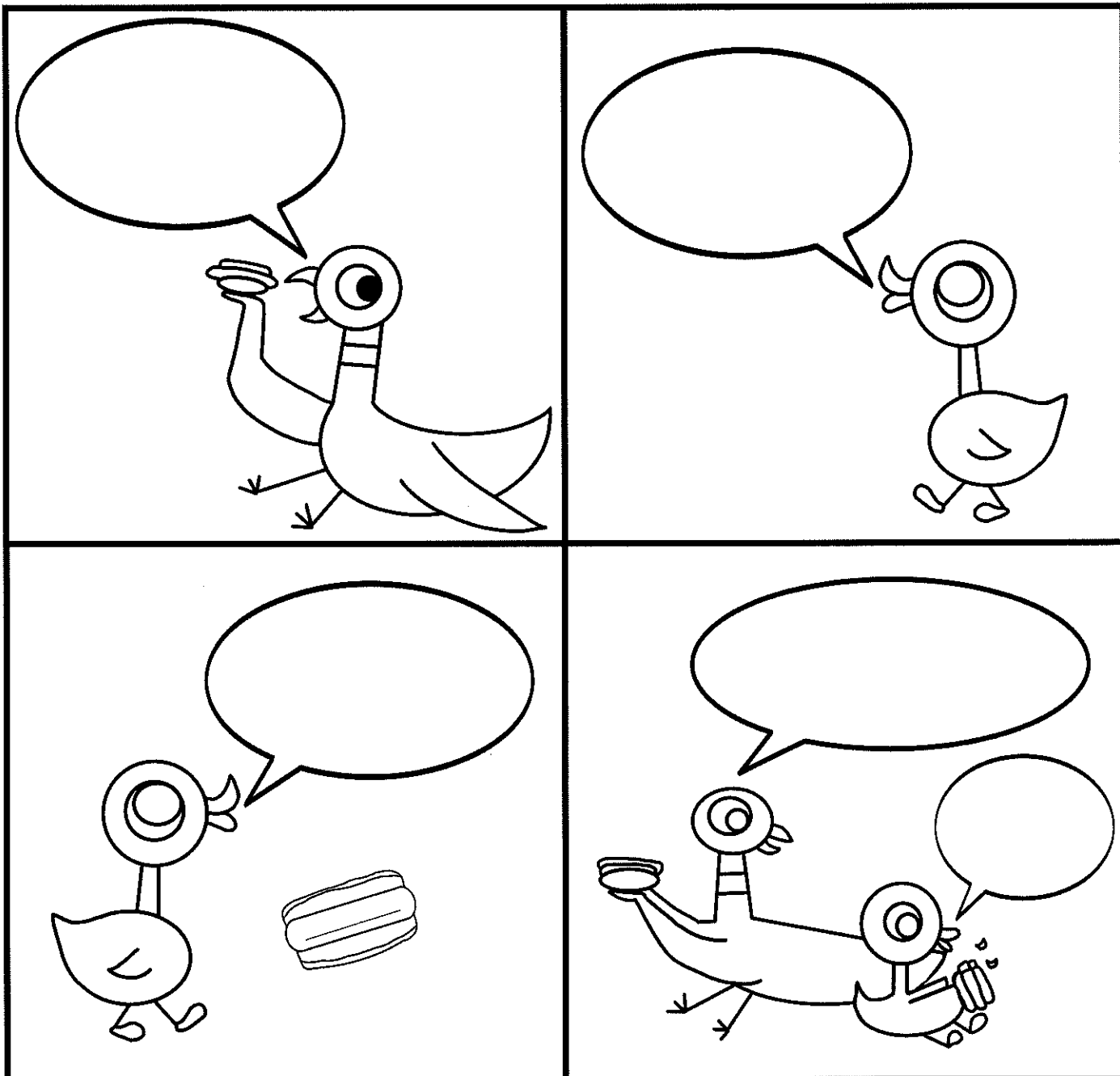

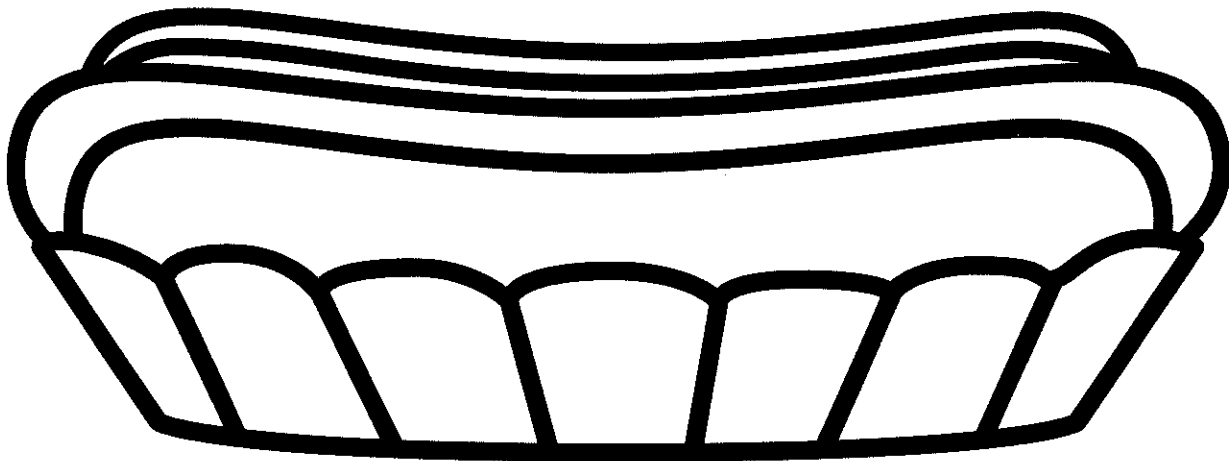
