

As teachers of special education students, we know your toolkit for specially designed instruction (SDI) is heavily needed to increase literacy outcomes and prepare students for post-secondary careers. To that end, the Office of Special Education is offering Orton-Gillingham training to special education teachers. The Orton-Gillingham approach is a direct, explicit, multisensory, structured, sequential, diagnostic and prescriptive way to teach literacy when reading, writing and spelling does not come easily to individuals, such as those with dyslexia. OSE will provide participants a stipend for the training. Below are the details for the training. The response by special education teachers to participate was highly appreciated by teachers.

- Special Education teachers selected must be able to attend and commit to all five sessions
- Teachers who complete the 5 Day Training will complete TimeSheet invoices on the last day of the PD session and submit all dates in one invoice
- Special Education Teachers who were previously trained cannot attend

- Special Education Teachers must have a roster of students in which they provide instruction
- Special Education Teachers who attend must have approval by their building principal to implement the strategies during small group instruction
- Special Education Teachers must submit examples of their class instruction on a monthly basis
- PD is capped at 45 participants
- Teachers must pick up their OG kits on select dates of distribution February 22 to 24, 2023 from 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm.

TRAINING SERIES for CST and Paraprofessionals in the Autism Programs

rethink Ed Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) On-Demand

Child Study Team members and paraprofessionals who work in the Autism Programs can support their students and respective teachers by accessing the on-demand ABA Learning Modules in RethinkEd's lesson library. CST and paraprofessionals can increase their skill set in the area of ABA and learn more about evidence-based support for learners with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Special education teachers that support the Autism Program all currently have access to ReThink.

Case managers and paraprofessionals for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder have 2 Training options:

- Basic Training: Educators can earn a certificate for 8-hours of professional development upon completion of all 11 Basic Training modules.
- Advanced Training: Educators can earn a certificate for each individual training module, amounting to 40-hours of professional development upon completion. This course can also be used to satisfy the RBT Certification coursework requirements.
