

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT for TEACHERS

General Education Teachers Supporting Exceptional Learners

The Office of Special will have four workshops to enhance the knowledge and understanding of general education teachers who instruct students with disabilities in their classes. These workshops are designed to provide general education teachers the foundational knowledge of Special Education Laws, IEPs, Co-Teaching, and incorporating UDL principles for diverse learners and their contributions to PLAAFP writing and IEP Goal development. Priority seating will first be given to general education teachers and Special Education Resource Teachers. TRAINING SERIES for CST and Paraprofessionals in the Autism Programs ${\bf rethink Ed}$ Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) On-Demand

Child Study Team members and paraprofessionals who work in the Autism Programs can support their students and respective teachers by accessing the on-demand ABA Learning Modules in RethinkEd's lesson library. CST and paraprofessionals can increase their skill set in the area of ABA and learn more about evidence-based support for learners with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Special education teachers that support the Autism Program all currently have access to ReThink.

Case managers and paraprofessionals for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder have 2 Training options:

- Basic Training: Educators can earn a certificate for 8-hours of professional development upon completion of all 11 Basic Training modules.
- Advanced Training: Educators can earn a certificate for each individual training module, amounting to 40-hours of professional development upon completion. This course can also be used to satisfy the RBT Certification coursework requirements.
