The New Jersey Music Educators Association (NJMEA) is launching an annual student conference for high school student musicians on Thursday, November 2, 2023.

The Student Music Conference will be a one-day event filled with workshops and music performances for students in grades 9-12 from across New Jersey. The emphasis of this conference will be to provide opportunities for high school students to grow as musicians and address the needs of a musician in today's world. This will include learning from industry leaders, developing non-music assets that a 21st century musician needs, and connecting with one's peers.

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NJMEA Student Conference Registration

- Event Date/Time/Location:
 - Thursday, November 2nd from 9:30 AM-1:15 PM
 - Rider University
- Registration Fee: **\$30 per school**
- Application Requirements:
 - Sponsoring Teacher must have a current and active NAfME membership.
 - Only schools located in New Jersey will be accepted.
 - Students must currently be enrolled in grades 9-12 (or an equivalent course at non-graded schools).
 - Student Counts: Individual schools may nominate a maximum of 15 students. Districts may nominate a maximum of 30 students (limit 15 per school).
- Please note that space is limited for this event. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis, with the first round of applications due Friday, September 15th.

Examples:

- 1 District, 1 School (up to 15 students): \$30
- 1 District, 2 Schools (School A: 15 students, School B: 15 students): \$60
- 1 District, 3 Schools (School A: 10 students, School B: 10 students, School C: 10 students): \$90
- All applicants will be notified of their acceptance within 1 week of their submission.

FAQ:

How many students can I bring?

Districts may bring a maximum of 30 students. Schools may bring a maximum of 15 students each.

- What should my students bring with them to the conference?
 - Students should bring a bagged lunch. Instruments are optional (refer to the final list of session topics that will be provided to determine instrument needs).
- How will I know which sessions my students are attending?
 - Students are welcome to attend sessions of their choosing, including performances and optional campus tours. Teachers/chaperones are responsible for monitoring student behavior at all times during the conference.
- How will I know if my students were accepted?
 - Sponsoring teachers will be notified of acceptance within 1 week of their submissions.

Field Trip Rationale:

- Subject Relatedness: Students have responded, performed, created, and connected to music standards of skills and knowledge as part of music instruction in their schools.
- Trip Description: Students will participate in hands-on music-making experiences, including sessions on a variety of topics, led by college professors and music industry professionals. Attendees will have opportunities to observe collegiate-level student performances and tour a college campus during the trip.
- Follow-Up: Students will reflect on their experiences with support from their teachers at their school site.
