## TOP TEN LIST for WHAT TEACHERS, STAFF & STUDENTS CAN DO:

- Report unusual odors, mold or other environmental conditions related to specific areas of the building to maintenance staff.
- Do not spray pesticides; report pest problems to maintenance staff.
- Reduce classroom clutter and utilize covered bins for classroom materials to make cleaning easier.
- Keep air vents clear of furniture, piles of books or other stored items.
- Avoid carpeting and old upholstered furniture. They are reservoirs for dust, mold and other allergens.
- Use only low odor, low toxicity cleaning, instructional, art and science products and follow manufacturers' instructions.
- Avoid use of aerosol products. Be aware that aerosols and harsh chemicals can trigger breathing problems and rashes in sensitive individuals.
- Keep furry or feathered pets out of classrooms.
- Minimize eating in the classroom. food stored in the classroom should be in sealed containers. Cleanup small spills promptly. Report large spills to maintenance staff.
- Serve on a committee to help promote a regular program of healthy school maintenance.
